

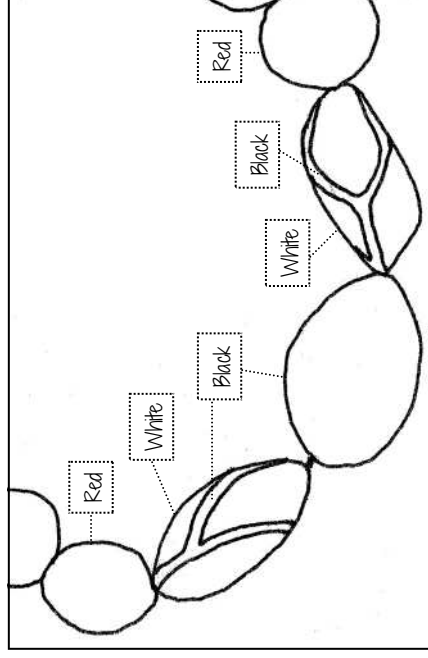

 Circa: 1920s

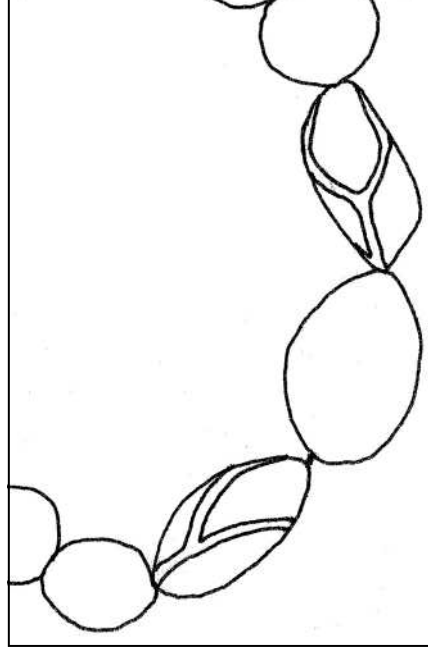
